Health survey?


How do we make sense of all these new tests... and the old ones







- KCs Increased collaboration synergy

Vets... researchers... judges... government/ regulatory bodies... they all must take responsibility and help out... for the dogs and the people.

We need a kinder, gentler approach as agents of change...

- A collaborative approach requires an empathetic relationship with the 'changee'
- We have to find the motivators and influencers
- We need to create the environment in which they can and will motivate themselves.





- People only change when they perceive value. So what are the motivators? For many of us health and welfare issues are obvious. Not so for all.
- What people say vs. what they mean... it is all about the dogs... or maybe winning in the show ring? Or fame as a breeder.
- We need people to be honest... not so that we can judge and shame them... but so we can design our messages to be appropriate and powerful.
- And / or we need to identify the ones who are 'onside' and work with them...



FYI – based on discussions at the meeting. This is another outtake from the original Agria Breed Profiles from 1995-2002 which are not yet available, but will be soon. My point here is that we need age patterns of disease and death not just median age at death to really understand breed differences. (This is life insured dogs up to 10 years of age, 1995-2002).

Some brief comments: To compare to other data... in this graph for Bernese, 50% were dead by about 8.5 years and that would be the median age at death. German Shepherds are hitting the 50% line at 10...CKCS getting close to that line...we might guess 10.5 or 11 as the median. All we can say for the Goldens is that 80% are still alive at 10.

Interesting is the lower survival to 5 years for the GSDs... our data show 'death' due to e.g. hip dysplasia and other causes in early ages.; maybe related to dogs being unfit to 'work'??
