





Action Items: 2nd IDHW / IPFD & DogWellNet.com

- Behaviour / temperament should be considered in breeding decisions
- Goals must be defined and considered on a breed x breed basis
- Viewing breeds as a population: both questionnaires & behaviour tests have a purpose; **terminology** should be comparable across countries
- Pass/fail and descriptive tests can be useful: but adapt to breeding goal
- **Education** is critical for behaviour test judges, show/breed judges, breeders and the public. On **DogWellNet.com** these stakeholder communities come together with discipline experts; tools include information and links, expert discussion forums, webinars/ presentations, sharing across stakeholder groups, e.g. kennel and breed clubs, breeders, veterinarians, regulators, researchers
- International collaboration can promote: efficient use and sharing of resources, creative efforts to 'get the work done' (e.g. international student projects) and attract funding from industry and other partners
