- The objective of Agria's Research Fund is for the allocated funds to be used to support **veterinary medical research**, development projects and research that in the long term leads to **preventive measures** for animals, as well as research that can demonstrate effects on improved **human health through interaction with animals and the importance of animals in society.**
- In 2025, Agria's Research Fund allocated approximately 10 million SEK for the benefit of dogs, cats, horses and farm animals.

Pet research



- Agria and Swedish Kennel Club Research Fund
- Since 2011, more than 100 million SEK has been allocated to over 200 research projects.
- The three research areas are:
 - The physical and mental health, performance and welfare of companion animals and technology development
 - The breeding and rearing of companion animals
 - The role of companion animals for humans and society



Agria Research Fund – examples

- The epidemiology of stifle joint disease in dogs with a focus on cranial cruciate ligament disease
- Long- term effects of motivational interviewing vs. traditional counseling on dog owners' adherence to veterinary dental home care: a three-year follow-up study:
- Support from social service dogs for students with school absenteeism
- Studies on genetic markers of diseases of the dog



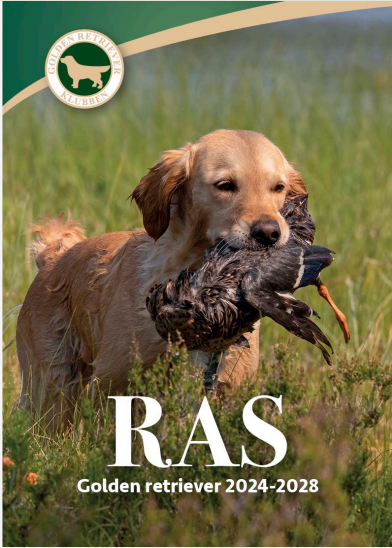
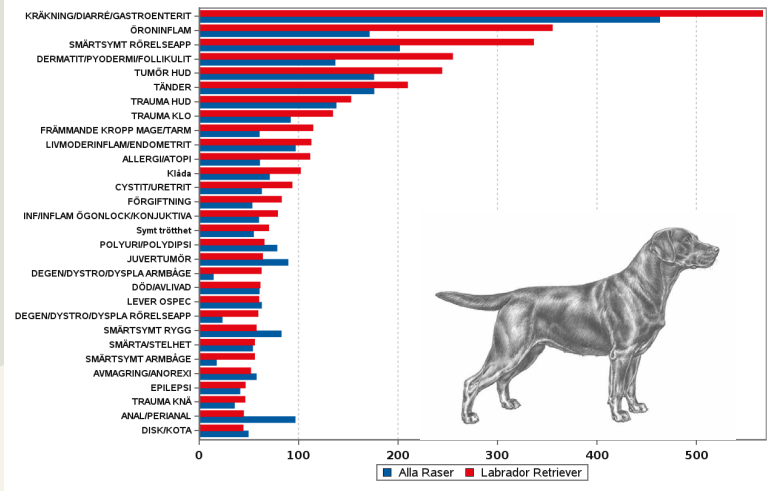

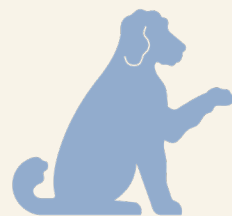
